

ADAPT-CREST Co-Learning

In December 2023, ADAPT and CREST welcomed Samuel Gebru to speak at our Quarterly Co-Learning event. As a social entrepreneur, community organizer, and policy analyst, Professor Gebru presented the "Eightfold Path" of Public Policy. He answered critical questions such as: who decides what happens, when, why, and how? Ultimately, allowing the audience to walk away with a more concrete understanding of the unique differences between public policy and policy analysis, identify key institutions in Massachusetts, and left us wondering - what do we achieve or give up based on our advocacy tactics?

CREST Stakeholder Trainings

"Conflict Across the Translational Science Spectrum" Workshop: On Thursday, February 22nd, our Senior Research Project Coordinator, Angelique Santiago, facilitated a "Conflict Across the Translational Science Spectrum" workshop. The first of many stakeholder trainings to be offered to CREST community partners.

"Research Readiness" Training: CREST recently added a new advisor to it's network - Alisa Lincoln from Northeastern University's Institute for Health Equity and Social Justice Research. As a Professor of Health Sciences and Sociology, Alisa Lincoln specializes in examining social factors and mental health. The "Research Readiness" training is another opportunity to enhance community partner capacity to effectively participate in the translational science process.

Linda Cline, Vice President of Programs of the National Council of Negro Women (NCNW) - Greater Boston Section, assisted in hosting the event, "Women of Courage & Conviction" at Venezia Restaurant in Boston back in October of 2023. Carmen Fields, Journalist and Author, was the keynote speaker and seven women received awards for their community service contributions.

Andrew Sharpe, Executive Director of the Authentic Caribbean Foundation (ACF), hosted a virtual event titled, "The Future of Community Health & COVID-19 " back in January 2024. The event was well attended by 50 participants and provided an update on the status of COVID-19 . Additionally, three panelists discussed topics on the intersection of community health, healthcare services, and nutrition.
