Jonathan Davis, MD

Dr. Jonathan Davis is Vice-Chair of Pediatrics and the Associate Director of the Tufts Clinical and Translational Science Institute at Tufts Medical Center, an Attending Neonatologist at Boston

Children's Hospital, and Professor of Pediatrics at Tufts University School of Medicine. His research has focused on neonatal drug and device development for the prevention and treatment of a variety of neonatal conditions. He has authored approximately 300 manuscripts and book chapters and received numerous grant awards from the NIH, the FDA, the March of Dimes, and many others. He is currently funded by NIH and FDA to develop better diagnostics and outcome measures for clinical trials and novel drugs and devices to improve outcomes in children.

Dr. Davis is Chair of the Neonatal Advisory Committee and an ad hoc member of the Pediatric Review Committee in the Office of Pediatric Therapeutics at FDA as well as a Senior Global Policy Advisor in Pediatrics for the Critical Path Institute. These positions permit him to work closely with governments, regulators, academic leaders, industry, and advocacy groups worldwide to help pass important legislation to promote the development of crucial therapeutics for infants and children.



Kirk Taylor, MD

President & CEO, Massachusetts Life Sciences Center

Kirk Taylor is a recognized, global pharmaceutical executive with deep expertise in Phase IlèIV drug development across CNS, oncology, and rare diseases. He was recently appointed by Governor Maura Healey to lead the Massachusetts Life Sciences Center on a

10-year economic growth trajectory, managing public and private funding. He has held leadership roles including Chief Medical Officer, Chief Strategy Officer, and SVP of Medical

Affairs, driving organizational transformation, strategic growth, and cultural evolution. Dr. Taylor has guided biotech startups through IPOs and multiple funding rounds with a people-centered, innovation-driven approach. In 2023, he was honored with the PharmaVoice 100 Executives Award for his industry impact.

Dr. Taylor earned his BA from Harvard College and studied piano at the Longy School of Music. He received his MD from SUNY Downstate, completed a neurology residency at Einstein College of Medicine, and a postdoctoral fellowship at UCSF.

He started his career at AT&T Bell Laboratories, where he held various engineering and management positions in digital communications systems. He currently mentors at the non-profit EforAll business accelerator and provides advisory and consulting services to startups and corporations.
